What if it's an emergency?

A true emergency medical condition is when symptoms are severe enough that you could reasonably expect serious danger to your health, such as:

- ✓ Serious burns
- ✓ Heavy bleeding
- √ Major trauma
- ✓ Severe chest pain
- ✓ Poisoning
- ✓ Sudden paralysis
- ✓ Chest pain
- Serious breathing difficulties
